What's happening at Nursery School!

Monday 25th January to Friday 29th January 2016

In Nursery school the children are still continuing to be interested in the Bear Hunt story- they have been making caves, acting out the story and using small world toys to recreate the story. Revisiting the story really helps children to develop their language and they learn how stories are constructed- something they need to know in order to write and tell their own stories when they get to school. There has been lots of interest in exploring ice and snow and the children are singing songs about ice and snow.

Last week the PGCE teaching students led a "Cookathon" with the children and they have posted some blog items on the website all about the cooking activities with some photographs of the children taking part. You can take a look and post a comment- maybe your child has talked about their cooking experience when they were at home? The recipes are also on the blog- if you try any of them out perhaps you can post a picture on tapestry and let us know how you got on.

Cooking is a great activity to do with your child. It supports lots of areas of learning. There is a lot of new vocabulary to learn and talking about what happens to the ingredients as they change when you cook with them involves lots of scientific language. You can also use many mathematical words as you follow the recipes and talk about measuring the quantities needed.

Many of the children are now able to talk to their keyworker about the library books they have taken home and shared with you. Being able to recall a story and retell it is another skill needed in readiness for developing early literacy skills for writing stories. You can support your child with this by asking them to tell you about the story after you have read it to them.


