

# What's happening at Nursery!

#### 2nd March to 6th March 2015

The first week of half term has been very busy for the children and they have had lots of new learning experiences. With your support and the staff's preparation they coped extremely well with the change of base room.

Experiencing change really helps children to build up their resilience and to face other difficult changes more confidently as they grow.

On Wednesday the Life Education Caravan visited Nursery school and the children were all able to meet Harold the giraffe and Maureen. The children learnt about keeping healthy and about their bodies. Take a look at Tapestry and find out more about what they did. You can make a comment about the visit and let us know if the children talk to you about what they learnt while they are at home.



On Thursday we had our first visit from some Police Community Support Officers, Ian and Duncan. They talked to some of the children about the importance of holding an adults hand when near the road, the importance of holding an adults hand when crossing the road and what might happen if we didn't. Ian and Duncan brought their speed monitor and fitted it on one of the posts outside. They talked about how it measured how fast the cars were moving and what safe speeds were.

They will be back again in a few weeks time to work with the rest of the children.

In Cherry room the children have had lots of physical challenges using soft play equipment and some new physioballs that have allowed the children to try out new movements and ways to balance. Outside the children have had fun in the new observation tower in the playground and have been challenging themselves on the bikes riding over the bridges and ramps. Movement and physical activity plays a huge role in creating nerve connections in the brain. These provide the foundations for all future learning including formal learning at school.



In Oak room the children have been improving their fine motor skills with activities that strengthen the muscles in their fingers and thumbs and develops their hand eye coordination. Great preparation for writing and drawing!! They have been counting and making patterns too using beads and other items. Talking about patterns and using interesting objects to count and sort helps to develop children's mathematical language.
