Tuesday 22nd November 2.00pm to 3.00pm

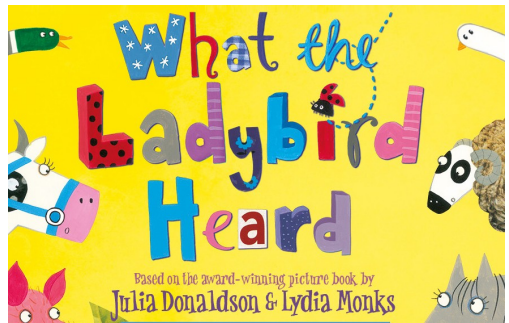
The deadline for applying online is 4th December 2016
